The meeting was called to order at 2:00 pm by President Bill Zech. We had approximately 28 members in attendance.

Extra Mile Award- At the banquet, the club will award the annual Extra Mile award to a club member who has contributed significantly to the club this past year. If you have a nomination, please forward the name of the person and their contribution to Bill Zech by the October meeting

Proposed Dues increase. As discussed by the Planning committee, there is a proposal to increase club dues (individuals would pay \$15; the family option is \$20). The Membership has been notified via the newsletter and the proposal will be discussed at the October club meeting.
