Proposed By-Laws Change



The club members will vote on the following by-laws change at the December meeting:

Article III, Section 5 currently reads, "The President and Vice President may serve more than one term, but not consecutively. However, the Vice President

may serve one term as Vice President and one term as President, if duly elected."

It was unanimously approved by the Planning Council to make the following change to Article III, Section 5: "The President and Vice President may serve more than one term, but not more than two terms consecu-

tively. However, the Vice President may serve two terms as Vice President and two terms as President, if duly elected."

This recommended change must be approved by a 2/3 majority vote of members present.
