Info from Jack Miller



Our January featured a presentation by Jack Miller on carving smoothie shore birds.

Jack has been carving for 8 years. He started carving fish decoys and then began carving smoothie shorebirds. He enters a Smoothie Shorebird competition in Middle Creek each year. In that competition, they submit 6 birds that are the same species and place them outside in the Marsh to judge them. He has received first place twice in this competition.

Using reference books and pictures is crucial. He'll use any

wood for the blanks. He prefers laminated pine because it has less fuzz. The head does not have to be the same wood used for the body; often he uses basswood for the head. The beak is made of a hardwood like hickory or English oak. He will use yellow glue to attach the head; no doll is necessary.

The birds can be carved with power or a knife. He usually will teach using the knife. He glues glass eyes into the eye channels that are cut to focus on the end of the beak. When looking up the beak you should just see the pupil of the eye. He puts Elmer's Wood Filler around the

eyes to seal them and give the illusion of eyelids.

Jack uses Formby's clear gloss lacquer to seal the carving before painting. He paints many thin coats, wet-on-wet. Popular colors are burnt umber, raw sienna and white paint. He draws his feathers using a white chalk pencil and then paints them with a specially cut paintbrush. He then seals them with lacquer.

Jack has offered to teach a seminar at the club and he will also be holding a seminar at the NorthEast WoodCarvers Roundup July 25-29, 2004.
