Program highlights

Gary Farber provided a talk on the carving the stock on muzzle loaded rifles. Gary started building guns in 1972. Back in colonial days, many of the early colonist used the Yeager rifle which was a short rifle. Later, long guns were developed in order to decrease loading time and increase range. The Kentucky rifle evolved from this and most Kentucky rifles were made in Pennsylvania. Each gunsmith had their own style based on county (Bucks, Lancaster, York, etc). Guns became more ornamental with the addition of brass patch boxes and in layed carving. Making a gun today is different than the colonial days. Better materials and tools are available. Most of the locks are built from a kit. All parts have to be fitted, drilled and tapped. He uses rifflers and Swiss carving tools to do the carving. The wood used is mostly curly maple, sometimes cherry or walnut is used. Gary uses a variety of stains for the color and the finish is a linseed oil based material. All of the guns Gary makes do shoot.

Joe DeAngelis- A nuthatch bird with habitat carved from glued up Lowe's paint stirring sticks—no wood like free wood!


Gary Steger- A competition working decoy that is weighted. Plans to enter the piece in the Ward competition.

Virginia Wilson has a piece of holly the size of a tree trunk. Anyone interested in having it to carve may contact her at 717-637-4417


Juried Show
