



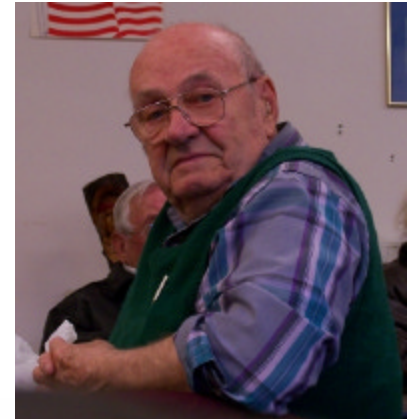
March Newsletter

Bird Feet

1. Use copper wire sized appropriately for the bird
2. Using a staple gun, attach the wire to your wood base using a shape
3. With light force, solder the legs using a butane torch and flux (Radenbauch sells a butane torch that gets to 1400 degrees for \$20, you can also purchase the torches at Harbor Freight)
4. After the foot is cool, power carve to narrow down the claws and carve off excess solder
5. Rough up the wire and apply yellow and blue ribbon putty to build up the feet
6. Carve down the putty
