Joe Legor is also recovering from surgery.

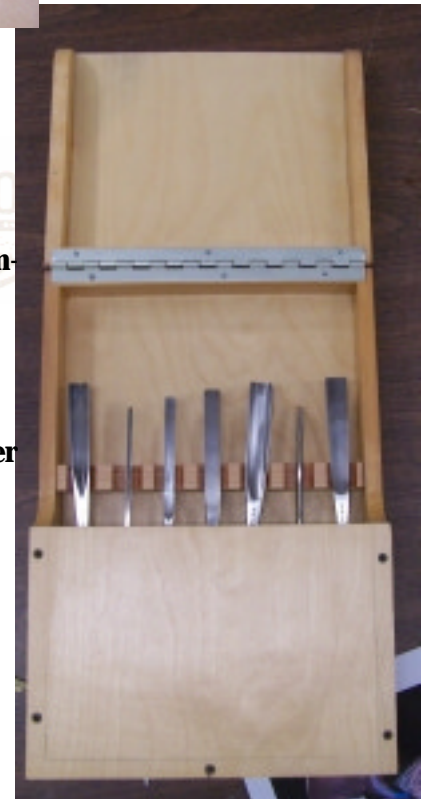
Linda Murphy is "hatching" a bad appendix but is feeling a little better.

Our thoughts are with all of these folks. We wish them all a speedy recovery.



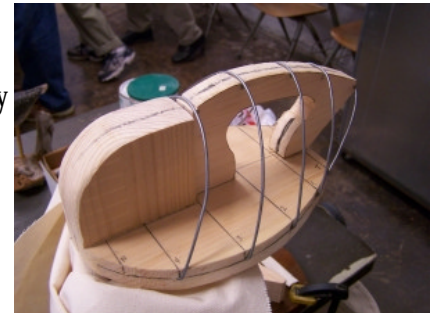
Carving Antique and Canvas Decoys By Dale Buffington

Dale has been a member of Conewago carvers for 2 years and has been carving 20 years now. He enjoys doing replicas of antique decoys as well as canvas decoys.

The trick to the Antique replicas is the finish.

Dale starts by using an antique decoy as a pattern, carves a replica and then paints it with acrylic paints. He will then antique the carving. One technique Dale uses for antiquing is coating the carving with Lacquer and set it on fire with a propane torch, then sand the piece. Another method he uses is to soak steel wool in cider vinegar and apply it to the carving. Using waxes, such as Bri-wax and rubbing it off so it takes some paint off with it is also an effective way to antique the carving.

Canvas Decoys are made with sail cloth canvas. A good book to use for reference is "Canvas Decoys of North America". This book contains 10 different canvas decoy patterns. The patterns are cut out on a band saw and then pieced together with 14 gauge wire. A muslin fabric is then stretched over the pattern and stapled to the wood. Carpet tacks are used to secure the canvas at the bottom of the decoy. The head can then be mounted. Once the piece is together paint it with acrylic paint and the canvas will shrink tight to the pattern, creating a water tight seal.
