January Meeting Minutes

- Doug Gable brought the meeting to order.
- There were nineteen members in attendance with one visitor (Fred Henderson).
- Jim Hiser gave the group an update on Nick Sciortino's recovery from surgery. He said that Nick is recovering well.
- Treasurer's Report: Expenses, \$500.00; Income, \$0; Balance, \$7,318.81.
- There was no Library Report other than it was asked that all books that are due be returned.
- Membership Report: We currently have 110 members, but only about 3/4 of them have paid their dues. Doug urges all members who have not yet paid their 2011 dues to do so. He also reminded everyone that if you have not paid your dues by the end of February, you will be dropped from the membership rolls.
- Jim Hiser gave an update on 2011 seminars and reminded everyone that members get a one-time \$25.00 discount on seminars given by "traveling instructors."
- Doug discussed the need to name a 2011 show chairperson. We want to settle this by the end of February. Anyone interested in taking on this important task should contact Doug.
- Linda Murphy reported on the Tuesday night projects. She also indicated that some of our recent Tuesday night projects had to be delayed because of the inclement weather.
- Doug led a discussion on how to advertise our club; he asked for ideas from anyone on how we might improve on this. We are anxious to add new members to our organization.
- Doug asked if there was any new business; there was none.
- Show and Tell included an angelfish, angel, deer, Santa candle, fan bird and bear, among others.
- Bill Martin gave a wonderful talk and demonstration on power sharpening gouges using the club's power sharpener.

January Planning Council Minutes

- The next two dates for Planning Council meetings were set for March 15th and May 10th at 7:00 p.m.
- There was a discussion on the club's by-laws. Doug asked that all members read our current by-laws and suggest any changes they think are proper.
- The Planning Council discussed what would be required to have the two library cabinets re-keyed (alike). Jim Rineaman volunteered to have them re-keyed if someone would pull the locks.
- Auditing of the club's financial records was discussed. It was agreed that two people would be asked to do this audit. It is expected that Nikki Otto and one other would conduct this audit. More information on this will be forthcoming.
- We still have not chosen an additional person who would be authorized to sign club checks. The council asked Linda Murphy to be this person and she has agreed. Her signature will be registered with the club's bank.
- There was a short discussion on the 2011 show. The first show planning committee meeting will be held February 20th (prior to the February monthly meeting).
- Doug advised the planning council that a person is needed to coordinate tasks for publicizing the show. Gary Peiffer will not be able to do it in 2011.
- Doug advised that a wood vendor has expressed a desire to buy a table at the 2011 show. The council agreed that it would be okay.
- A discussion of the summer picnic was discussed. Tentatively, July 24th was suggested and would be part of our July monthly meeting.
- Next, the annual banquet was discussed and it was determined that we would have it after the annual show, as we did in 2010. It was suggested that we try to have it at 6:00 p.m. instead of 7:00 p.m. Firm information on this will be advertised in a future newsletter.
- Doug led a discussion on methods we might use in getting youths interested in joining our organization. The council discussed insurance liability concerns if we allowed youths to carve at our Tuesday night get-togethers. The council agreed that parents would have to be present to supervise the youth.
- Linda Murphy and Doug led a discussion on firming up monthly meeting programs. The council agreed that it is very important that we provide the membership with the very best meeting programs possible. This will encourage meeting attendance and provide a valuable service to our membership. It was requested that the next three monthly meeting programs be highlighted in the next newsletter.
