Hello All and welcome to July. If you have been sheltering in place or Quarantined, or Locked Down or if you are like me prefer to call it an opportunity to take things a little easier, however you look at it things certainly have changed.

- Well the club is changing too. The recommendations on a state level are to wear a mask, wash your hands often, and clean your area. The Conewago Carvers are following all of these recommendations. We are asking everyone to wear a mask in the building. I know it is unpopular with some but it is very important for the majority of the members. Remember wearing a mask protects others. It is a simple thing for you to do and may save someone's life.
- The second change is pretty simple too. We have moved the furniture around in the room to allow a social distance and have space for 15 carvers. This will allow plenty of space for us to carve and good spacing for the upcoming seminars.
- The third change is the way we enter the EBACC. The center is asking us to carefully monitor the people coming into the building. I spoke to the manager and we now have permission to use the lower door on Tuesday evening. That is our regular door. A new feature will be a doorbell, clearly marked for the carvers. That bell will ring in the carving room and we will come and open the door whenever you get there.
- Change number Four is our morning Carve time will be changing to Thursday morning by unanimous consent by all the morning carvers. The Main door will be monitored by a volunteer for us to enter, or once again, you can ring the door bell and we will come and let you in through the lower door.

So lots of changes but I believe we are rolling with the times and doing the best we can. I do have a variety of masks available, in a wide range of sizes, for you if you do not have one. I suggest you stick one in your tool box or back pocket so you have one. I understand the mask is hard for some but I personally really appreciate the person who wears one. Our members who are older or who have medical issues agree they feel much more comfortable when masks are worn. Thank you for understanding.

Clean your area.

Of course since it is summer those who wish for the fresh air and the mask-less carving can make use of the lovely tree near the parking lot or the picnic tables behind the build to gather to carve. Bring a lawn chair or carry one out from the clubroom and enjoy!
