<u>Policies and Information.</u> (Please keep this information on file for your reference, it need not be submitted with the Registration form).

General Information:

All classes are held at the East Berlin Community Center, 405 North Avenue, East Berlin, PA unless otherwise informed.

All classes are first come first served. If a class is full, you have the option of being placed on a waiting list in case another student withdraws from the class.

If you request a spot in a seminar, we will hold a spot for you for (1) week. If we have not received the 50% deposit in one week, your name will be removed and the spot will be open for other students.

Class times typically are 9:00 am-4:00 pm but may vary slightly depending on the instructor.

All tools must be provided by the student to participate in the class.

It is the student's responsibility to attend the seminar on the appointed days and times (mark your calendars). Lodging (if needed) and meals are the responsibility of student.

Carving involves sharp tools. The instructor and club cannot be held responsible for injury or death. It is highly recommended that the student bring a carving glove, thumb guard, carving apron or similar safety equipment to use during the seminar.

Payment and Cancellation Policy

Because we have to make a commitment on number of students to the instructor, a 50% deposit is due at the time you sign up for the seminar. The remaining 50% is due 60 days before the seminar. This 50% deposit is non-refundable and not transferrable unless:

- -The instructor cancels the seminar.
- -Cancellations or closures as ordered by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
- -In compelling circumstances, refunds may be provided at the discretion of the Seminar committee. All decisions by the committee are final.

In addition to the 50% deposit, any balance paid for the cost of the seminar will also be refunded under the scenarios described above.
