He came in and gave the basics on how to handle most situations that result in blood loss due to us putting holes in our bodies or cutting off things that should not be cut off due to misuse of tools or mishaps beyond our control. He gave a really great presentation and even went so far as to check out our first aid kit. We passed. We will, however, be updating some of the items in our kit. Key words for bleeding: pressure, elevate, 911, tourniquet if necessary. But before all of that: PRECAUTIONS. Its better to keep the blood in where it belongs. Great speaker. Very informative.
